The Most Difficult of Moments: Pastoral Care for Acutely and Terminally Ill Children and their Families.

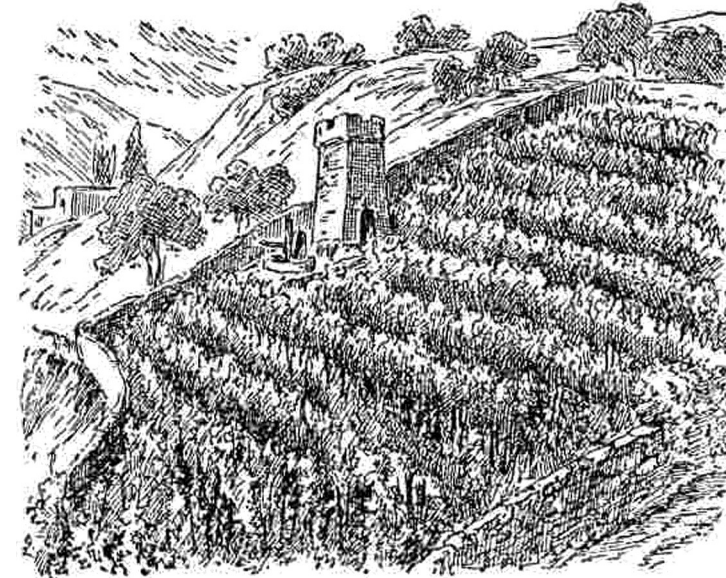

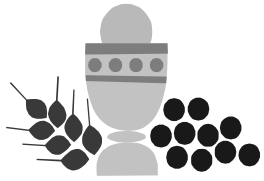
