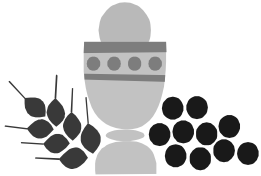

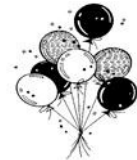
On the weekend of October 25/26, 2014, Bishop
