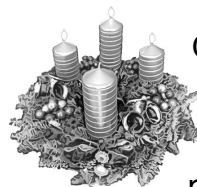
Cemetery Committee Meeting

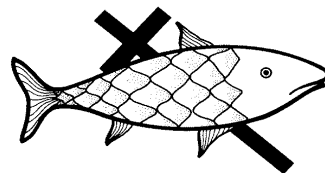
