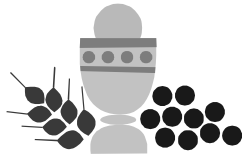

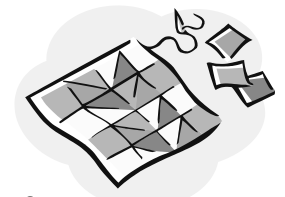
Local K of C to Sponsor Youth Free Throw Championship
