The fourth bishop of Richmond, James Gibbons (later, Cardinal Archbishop of Baltimore) was one of the most influential figures in American Catholic church history. Traditional and loyal to Rome, Gibbons still defended both episcopal collegiality and American democracy against their Catholic critics. He personally convinced Pope Leo XIII to lift the ban on Catholics joining trade unions and influenced Leo's landmark social justice encyclical Rerum Novarum (1891).

Passed by Parish Council on March 10, 2020
