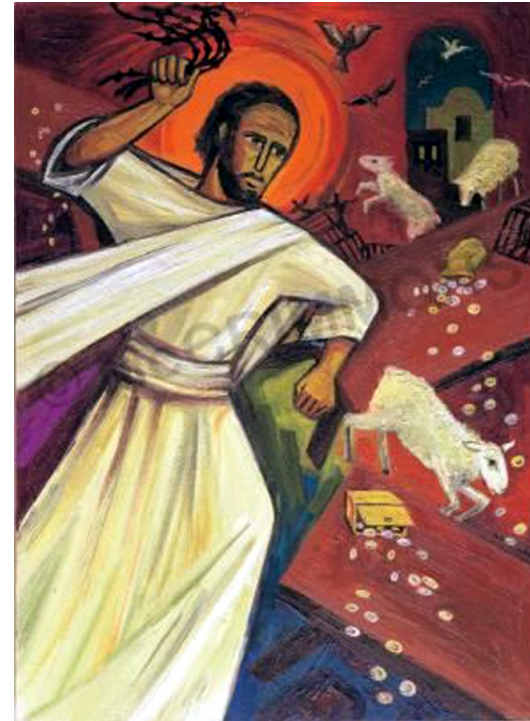
Nice Selection of Books and Tapes For All Hoping to Start a Library

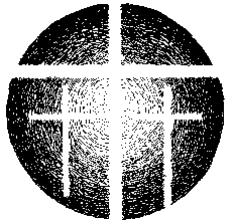

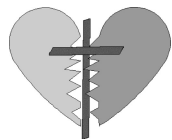

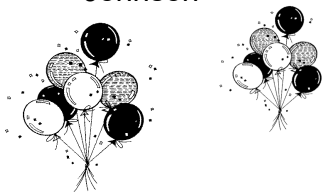
