A Theological Moment with Fr. Jim

Matthew 17:1-9

No one had ever seen anything like it before. A cloud, the "Shekinah", cast a shadow over Moses, Elijah and Jesus. This cloud was present over the Ark of the Covenant in earlier times. This was a sign of the Spirit's subtle presence over her people. Moses, the giver of the law that gave us boundaries and identity and Elijah, the prophet, who helped us see God's love for others outside of our circle of faith. It was overwhelming. Deeply personal experiences that defy words are described by images such as the birth of your first child, grandchild, the sunrise over Narragansett Bay or the sunset at the Peaks of Otter in our Blue Ridge. The moments cannot be relived, but only savored.

Yet, who can blame Peter who tries to contain the mystery by building tents or more correctly, booths. But a "mystery" in the true sense of the word is not something solved or resolved like a television episode. A mystery is unfathomable and intriguing at the same time. The experience draws us in. We don't want to leave.

But, yet as the disciples experienced the real presence of Christ on the mountain, they must come down the mountain and carry that experience in the souls and bring it to others. For the real presence of Christ is also in the people at the bottom, not at the peaks. So look for that real presence in the mother who carries her twelve year old child from the car to that child's wheelchair every time the family drives onto the church parking lot. Look for that real presence of Christ in the once impoverished hungry person now feeding a hungry person she meets. Look for that real presence of Christ in the racially diverse group of people marching in solidarity on the anniversary of MLK's birthday. Look for that real presence of Christ when an older child is teaching a younger child how to do math. Look for that real presence of Christ when people are getting current and honest with one aother in their bi-polar group. Look for that real presence of Christ when a family member is letting go of years of resentment and taking the lead in carrying for a parent in assisted living.

Yes, the "mountain top" experiences certainly are to be savored and enjoyed. They energize you and me. But to spread the mystery and our appreciation thereof, we drink in our souls and come down the mountain. The "Shekinah" - the Holy Spirit - is in too many places to be catalogued. We truly miss out if we stay on the mountain too long.

As the words from "Sound of Music" say: "How can you hold a rainbow in your hand?"
