To provide a little inspiration during the current health crisis, I will devote the month of April to stories of the heroism of Virginia Catholics in past epidemics. Throughout the nineteenth century, yellow fever was a periodically recurring plague faced by Virginians. During an 1855 yellow fever epidemic concentrated in Norfolk and Portsmouth, two thousand people died in these cities alone. While many Protestant clergy fled the area to escape the contagion, the two local Catholic priests and the religious sisters of the Daughters of Charity courageously stayed behind to care for the afflicted and minister to the suffering.

On the Cover

On today's cover is the painting, *St Peter Weeping before the Virgin* Painted in 1647, by the Baroque Artist Guercino, this painting is also known as *The Tears of Saint Peter*. The artist has not told us whether the scene is before or after the Resurrection of Jesus. We must draw our own conclusions, noting however, that both Peter and Mary are holding kerchiefs and have sad expressions. Mary is listening intently to Peter's confession of his denial of Christ. Is she sad because of the content of the confession or because her son has not yet risen from the dead? Interestingly, Guercino has painted Mary with a halo and St. Peter without.
