The Diocese of Richmond requires each parish to comply with the Safe Environment regulation as a measure to prevent sexual abuse of children, young people, and our most vulnerable members. CEASA, the Committee for Education and Action on Sexual Abuse (formerly the Call-To-Action Committee), serves as the Safe Environment Committee for the parish of OLP. CEASA has been continually active with the OLP action plan, but because of the COVID-19 pandemic the committee has had limited contact with the people in our parish. We have created this part of the bulletin, called CEASA Chat, as a way of communicating what we are doing to eliminate sexual abuse and help our Holy Catholic Church heal the wounds of the victims and perpetrators. 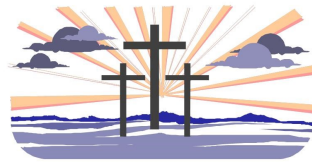
Reconciliation

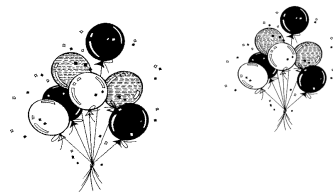
