A Theological Moment With Fr. Jim

In 1982, Sally Fields won an academy award for her performance in the movie, "Places of the Heart." The ending (spoiler alert!) was great Catholic Theology of Eucharist. There is a scene where all are gathered in a Baptist Church and they are sharing communion. They pass around the bread and grape juice as they share and the pastor recites what Jesus said at the Last Supper. I said that it was good "Catholic Theology" because the camera flashed to individuals who had died in the film, including an African American man who had been lynched for accidentally shooting Sally Fields' husband. The man who shot him was drunk at the time. Sally Fields' husband was sitting right next to the murderer at the Lord's Supper! They were present at the Eucharist as we believe Jesus brings those who have died and we have loved to the Eucharist.

There were also some of Sally's antagonists and enemies there as well as her children, new boyfriend and friends. Many had touched Sally Field's heart throughout the plot. All have touched the Lord's heart. In other words, the Father's heart is enormous. Come to the Father. Doesn't your heart have many places? I know that this summer there are many friends from previous parishes that I am just dying to visit. There isn't enough time to see them all and that really bothers me for they "live" in my heart. There is Jane, the widow of my friend and deacon, Bob Baker. There is the Mallory family in Williamsburg. There are former young adults from my Clarksville days who now live in Raleigh. When I visit with them and hopefully many more, it soothes my soul. They have touched a tender place where love dwells. Perhaps that there won't be time is a consequence of Original Sin, when we are limited in our humanity in our ability to care for one another. Who does your heart ache for during the summer months? If you and I hunger for love within our limitations and brokenness, we can't imagine the care of that Great Lover who wants us to dwell with him. The heart of Jesus ached. Something powerful happened at the Jordan River that sent him inviting us into the heart of the Father. Jesus did all he could to bring us into the heart of the Father. He told stories of lost sons, lost daughters, lost coins and lost sheep. "Come into the heart of the Father."

When we still didn't get it, he died for us. And being "bears of small bring" (like Winnie the Pooh) he rose and set his Holy Spirit.

Does your heart ache to see someone? Do you miss a good friend? Know that God aches for you. "Come into the Heart of the Father."
