

"Faith Filled Memories / "Anamnesis"

"We remember how you loved us to your death. And still we celebrate for you are with us here. We remember. We celebrate. We believe." (Marty Haugen)

When we've lost someone close to use who died, it is a great emotional support to remember them at the Lord's Supper or at the Mass In a special way we feel they are with us at the time. How? Because for Christians, the Lord Jesus is present at the Mass. He does not come alone.

Today we hear a lot about the "Real Presence." One of the many ways that Jesus is present to us in "Anamnesis." The short definition is "memory" or remembering. When Jesus was at the Last Supper, he said "Do this in memory of me!" So, when we remember Jesus, he comes and he is present. We remember Him so that the fullness and power may be effective here and now.

The Catechism says "That through the power of the Holy Spirit we make present again the Salvific act." He comes to be with us each and every time. As we break bread, we break memory. When He comes to us, he does not come alone. The comforting thought and reality is he brings with them all those whose death is still painful. But now just those who have died, but those we miss who have moved away and we hardly ever see.

I often think and miss those from St. James in Hopewell, Ascension in Virginia Beach, Sacred Heart in Petersburg and other places. That is why I send out 160 Christmas cards. There is not enough time to visit them during the summer. But on a certain level, as I remember them at mass with Jesus they are with me. Following his command to "Do this in memory of me" is not only a way to eternal life, it is a necessity to not die of a broken heart in this life.

We can remember George Washington and Thomas Jefferson which is nice, but they are not present. Remembering my late mother with Jesus - well, he brings her to mass. When we talk about "Real Presence" we are talking about an unfathomable mystery to which by definition we cannot exhaust or fully define. But there are aspects to this mystery we can nevertheless celebrate. I celebrate the fact that our other Christian brothers and sisters also remember Jesus at their Lord's Supper. Perhaps "anamnesis" can be a point of dialogue, solidarity and a warm discussion with other believers from other Christian Traditions.
