# A PASTORAL MOMENT WITH FR. JIM The Receptive Soil of the Joyful Seed

As you have heard from me "ad nauseum," we are baptized (as we hear in the anointing prayer) "priest, prophet and king" (builder of the reign of God). We are called, therefore, to ministry by our baptism. **Priest**: to make our world a holy place; **Prophet:** to witness to the Gospel by setting a good example or speaking; **King**: builder of God's reign by participating in ministry.

For someone who goes through RCIA and is baptized, the expectation is to immediately participate. For an infant child, there is a "seed" for ministry placed in the child's heart.
