

"But who do you say that I am?" (Matthew 16:13-20)

To answer your question, Lord Jesus, I would like to tell you where I see you and experience you.

You are the one I experience as I watch a mother move her daughter who has disabilities from their car in the parking lot into her wheelchair each Sunday. They travel at other times all over for therapy sessions as the younger one desires to walk up to meet the bishop on the day of her Confirmation.

You are the one I thank as you have placed my earthly dad in good hands. Dad, at 94 years old, lives in assisted living. My sister Mary takes him out several times a week to his doctors appointments. She is always there by his side.

You are the one who is present as over 80 boxes of groceries are given out on Saturdays. The parishioners have bonded with the poor in the midst of the Appomattox food desert. There are smiles, laughter, tears and joy as they have come to know another's story over the past years.

Christ, Jesus, you move to another venue. There is a break in their loneliness as they are being brought your whole body. Homebound and hospitalized people share their stories. There are tales we healthy ones do not understand. "For what you have hidden from the learned and the clever, you have revealed to the merest children." They share with those who visit the truth of suffering and the cross.

Lord Jesus, you are present in the children. On your birthday (Christmas) they sing and they dramatize a tale of hope. We who perpetually have an inner child, have a tear in our hearts.

Not all is light and happy in your presence. You challenge us to justice and to look at "the other" as one of us - to protect the innocence of the little ones for example, and to have the healthy but uncomfortable conversation about abuse.

Lord Jesus, you are all these and much more. But above all, I am grateful for your presence in my (our) life. We can point you out and know that we may have challenging days, we are *never* abandoned.
