

A Pastoral Moment with Fr. Jim

In Matthew 22:15-21, the Pharisees and Herodian's try to trap Jesus, First of all, this is an alliance and not a friendship. Alliances are two normally opposing groups joing against a common enemy. The Pharisees are about upholding the Mosaic Law. They oppose the Romans. They believe an image on a coin is idolatry. The Pharisees even believe that there will be a resurrection (but that is a story for another time). The Herodian's are supported by the Romans. Herod is a puppet king installed by the occupiers. The Herodian's care about power more than the Jewish faith. When the enemy (Jesus) is beaten, then they go back to fighting with each other.

One can say that there is a lack of integration between the two groups about what it means to be friends. Their lives re fragmented. To the question: "Is it lawful to pay the census tax to Caesar or not?" Jesus responds: "Then repay to Caesar what belongs to Caesar and to God what belongs to God."

What does Caesar get? A tax. A coin! What does God get? Our whole being. Our hearts and our souls. For God's good order (the Lord does not want chaos. Chaos is of evil.) we pay the coin. But our whole life and the rest of our life is geared towards God. As Paul says, "Whether you eat or drink, do it for the glory of God." Orthodox Jewish people said that God even blesses a husband and with in their most intimate moments.

Of course, if there is a conflict between civil authorities and our faith, we need to at time disobey or confront the authorities. There are issues, for example, in which we challenge the Supreme Court non violently. What we do on Sunday at Eucharist we take with us for the rest of the week. Caesar should not impinge on our faith, but we need to support Caesar when he brings "holy order" to our society.

If not, then we might quote the words from the movie: "Do the Right Thing: - "Fight the power that be!"
