

A Pastoral Moment with Fr. Jim "The Gratitude Overcomes Disappointment" Matthew 20:1-16

My lack of gratitude and my ego got in the way and caused me to be a poor sport. As a senior at Rhode Island College, I had hoped to receive an award as a distinguished athlete and student after four years. I ran cross county in the fall and track in the spring. I was also a sports writer for our campus newspaper, the "Anchor." Some years I was even the sports editor.

The award went to a basketball star who had scored over 1,000 points in his career. I acted out my disappointment by purposely missing the baccalaureate, resigning as sports writer and leaving the spring sports award banquet early (besides grumbling and complaining). I should have stopped to think about how God had blessed me those past four years. I had gotten my name and picture in the newspaper for running and winning several races. Our team won a champion-ship in cross country my senior year. I had the honor and the privilege of running for the best coach in all of the New England states, Raymond Dwyer. I made wonderful life long friendships with teammates Ray Danforth and Tommy Kenwood. Instead, my ego wanted more. Yet, the award was not mine to receive. All good fortune is a gift from God.

In the Gospel, we learn of other ungrateful people. They are part of the vineyard and something greater than themselves. They were getting paid and were employed. They had co-workers with them whom they could befriend. Yet, they were resentful and jealous of others. Where was the gratitude? Gratitude would be to rejoice in the accomplishments of others.
