

A PASTORAL MOMENT WITH FR. JIM

Many of us have done things out of anger that we are ashamed of later. We wish we could have replayed the scenarios over again. A year and a half ago, I walked out of a staff meeting and just shouted: "I would like some respect, please!" After calming down, I went back to the staff and apologized. It seems that was one of the several times in my life where "anger had me" instead of me possessing anger. In other words, I was consumed by my anger.

Jonah, being consumed by the whale, was a metaphor about his anger consuming him. The Ninevites were related to the Assyrians who had conquered the ten tribes of Israel many years earlier. Although these particular Ninevites were not even living in those times, the hatred and racism of Jonah were still there. As we read in Jonah 3:1-20 this Sunday, he "white knuckled it" (as they say in addiction and recovery). He went begrudgingly. And even then, he waited for God to still nuke the Ninevites. But God forgave them.

In our Gospel, Mark 1:14-20, I believe the disciples, called while fishing, lead a life consumed by meaninglessness. You can hear James and John talking. "Each week, it is the same old, same old. We go to synagogue and the preacher does not connect with us."

Our Friday nights we go to the same bar and rink the same cheap wine and hear the same boring jokes. We work our fingers to the bone. There has to be more to life than this. Suddenly, they encounter the Lord. "This man has something and I want some of that."

It really does happen in life. A lonely person meets someone and it clicks. A teacher strikes a note in a student's heart and there are plans for a new career. Yes, Jesus is the meaning life!

So, what consumes me? What consumes you?

Might that we be consumed by Christ and His Spirit as He directs us to new adventures!
