A PASTORAL MOMENT WITH FR. JIM

Learning a lifelong skill is a gift that keeps on giving. At thirteen years old, Fr. Patrick Quinn taught me to shoot a lay-up at CYO basketball practice. Every time I missed, I was supposed to run a lap around the gym. Finally, he said: "Just skip the lap and concentrate on hitting the back board with less power." It worked!

As I was trying to preach as a seminarian, Fr. Bob Perkins (my supervisor) critiqued me and said: "Jim, don't be so damn theological! If you don't know what it means, how can you expect to reach the people. Speak from your heart."

We all have stories of teachers, mentors and supervisors who gave us life long skills. They empowered us. In John 6:1-15, Jesus empowers the people to feed one another. Those who had lots of dried salted fish shared with those who had none or very little. Those who had lots of bread shared with those who had none. The real sign, wonder or marvelous deed was that Jesus changed selfish hearts into loving, giving and generous hearts. Also, I might add, whenever people learn a life skill, Christ is present.

It is a miracle or sign, wonder or marvelous deed because some people do not want to be empowered. We know because they did not want Jesus to leave and go to the mountain alone. They wanted Jesus to do the feeding. In a sense, they wanted Jesus to be their co-dependent and keep rescuing them. Didn't they learn anything?

That is why in another part of the Gospels, Jesus asked a disabled man: "Do you really want to be healed?" To be healed meant that the man could no longer sit and beg. To be healed, the man would have new responsibilities. But he would be empowered.

As I left Good Shepherd to go to my new parish, I gave the team all the information about the RCIA. But they did not pick up the mantle. A year later, two vans of folks drove up to visit me. As they got out of the vans, one asked: "Can you tell us again about the difference between a candidate and a catechumen?"

Again, do you really want to be empowered??
