

### A PASTORAL MOMENT WITH FR. JIM

It was 2001 in the Petersburg, Virginia area. Both St. Joseph's in Petersburg and Sacred Heart in Prince George (neighbors separated by just five miles) were having lay people trained to lead morning prayer and evening prayer with communion. These were called "lay presiders" and they also were prepared for Sundays if the priest was away. The lay presiders would occasionally give "reflections" [short homilies] on Sundays to give the people another point of view and to stay in practice. In the midst of this were men in the diaconate program preparing for ordination.

The lay presiders were both men and women. To have deacons only would eliminate the voices of women. Personally, like Deacon Lou Burgess, I saw how to we could accommodate both lay presiders and deacons. After all, as I was a priest, I had no problem sharing the pulpit and leadership of prayer. This was confusing, however, for some in the pew. I was once asked "Fr. Jim, which is more powerful: a deacon or a lay presider?" I thought about it and I remembered Mark 9:30-37 and Jesus saying: "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be last and all and servant of all." Also from Mark 8:35: "...but whoever loses his/her life for mu sake and that of the gospel will save it."

So the short answer I gave was that it depends who wants to give of themselves, die to self and serve with all their heart is the most powerful. Ordination and fancy titles to not guarantee that someone is greater. There are days the lay presider, caring for spouse and children and preaching her heart out is the most powerful. And there are days that the deacon or priest is more powerful. Living the Gospel and giving one's life for others is the great equalizer.

A title like "monsignor" or "vicar" means nothing compared to the parents I observe who are 27/7 caring for their children with disabilities. Moreover, a title of "exaltation" means that someone needs to work harder than the rest of us and set an example.

We Roman Catholics have to stop worshipping the hierarchy and worship Jesus the "suffering servant!" We need to show the same respect (or even more) to those working to pass out food to hundreds.

The pyramid of the church needs to be turned upside down.
