A PASTORAL MOMENT WITH FR. JIM

Jesus' controversy with the Pharisees is marked by the opposition between a formal, exterior religion (rules and regulations disconnected from the lived experience of the people) and the real, interior demands of the Kingdom of God (caring for the widows and orphans and welcoming the stranger).

The disciples have started to free themselves from the disconnected religious precepts and the Pharisees take advantage of that opportunity to situate Jesus outside of what they consider the tradition of the people. They make ritual washing more important than acts of charity and justice.

The Lord Jesus sets the record straight that he and his disciples are following the great prophets like Isaiah. The ritual washing or picking grain on the Sabbath so others can eat have been made a distraction to avoid the real demands of the Good News and the Gospel.

One way to water down the Gospel is to transform it into a series of formal rules that need to be observed only externally. Those who do that or try to do it look with contempt at those who, in their judgement, do not comply with the external rules.

Often, the poor consider themselves "sinners" because they live in a complex and confused world without being able to follow what Jesus calls "human precepts." These norms characterize Christians who are arrogant, devoid of compassion, people whose hands are clean but wonders if they have a heart.

True cleanliness consists in putting the word of god into practice (Deuteronomy 4:1, James 1:17 - a word of love, a gift of God from whom all things come.) It demands of us concrete gestures towards others - again caring for orphans and widows, visiting victims of poverty, exploration, those who are strangers, refuses and immigrants.
