

### A PASTORAL MOMENT WITH FR. JIM

So the ego battle between the disciples who follow the Lord God continues. In the Gospel last week, the disciples of Jesus were arguing about who was the greatest. This was right after Jesus announced he would be laying down his life for them. Irony!

This week in Numbers 11:25-39, Joshua and Nun complained to Moses that two people named Eldad and Medad were prophesying even though these latter two were not part of the inner group. There was jealousy because the spirit (Holy Spirit) had been bestowed in Eldad and Medad. Joshua and Nun were angry because they had no control over where the Holy Spirit landed.

In the Gospel, Mark 9:38-48), the disciples complained to Jesus because again, those who were not in the inner circle were doing great things. They were driving out demons. But Jesus tells us: "For whoever is not against us is for us." Some Roman Catholics also can get pumped up and declare: "We have the real presence of Christ and other Christians do not!"

I want to take a lesson from Pope Frances and build bridges rather than fences. Have we ever stopped to think that other Christians (Protestants) also have the presence of Christ in their churches? Am I bold enough to tell Jesus where he can and cannot go? So let us attempt to make a list about how Jesus is present to the Roman Catholic and others.

First, there is memory. When we remember Jesus, he is present. We call it "anamnesis." As we break bread, we break memory. All Christians remember Jesus. He is there. Second, Christ is present in the Word. When we proclaim the Scriptures, he is there. After one does a scripture reading, he or she says: "The Word of the Lord" and looks at the people. God's word has become part of those gathered at church. All Christians proclaim the word on Sunday. He is there. Third, Jesus says: "Where two or three are gathered in my name, I am present in their midst." That means fellowship. Even before we start praying, Christ is there as folks gather and welcome on another. The Protestants and other Christians were doing fellowship long before Roman Catholics after the Second Vatican Council. Christ was and is present. Fourth: The Lord's Supper. Christ is present in the breaking of the bread. We have different interpretations on this, but nevertheless, he is there. Remember that when we remember him, he comes to be with us. Fifth: The Holy Spirit. The Spirit moves and we no not have any control how SHE moves whether our names be James, John, Peter or Eldad and Medad

Let us celebrate what we have in common rather than complain about what divides us.

Justice & Peace Update: It's time for Kairos Cookies again. Eileen Brennen will be volunteering in the upcoming Kairos Ministry [Prison Ministry] Weekend and is asking for cookies no later than October 27th. Note that Eileen is asking for only 1-2 dozen from each volunteer



baker. The key ingredient is PRAYER. Pray over the cookies as you drop them onto the cookie sheets and bake them. Ask God to use your cookies as a source of His love to shine on the prisoners and staff of the Kairos Weekend. Pray that each cookie brings the inmate, officer or warden who eats it is closer to God. We want every person to become part of the family of God. Prison guidelines are: Cookies should be between 2 and 2 1/2 inches in diameter and not more than 1/2 inch thick. It is very important not to use icing, sugar or any other type of coating on the outside of the cookie. Do not add any kind of fruit or nuts to the cookies. Place 1 dozen cookies in a quart sized zip lock bag. Label the bag. Favorites are peanut butter, oatmeal, chocolate chip, molasses and sugar cookies.
