A PASTORAL MOMENT WITH FR. JIM

Happy First Sunday of Advent! We are called to be vigilant, but not vigilantes! We are called to be watchful - watchful and vigilant for what? For signs of hope. We also begin a Jubilee Year.

Our theme is "Pilgrims of Hope." The world "jubilee" comes from the word "Yabel" which means "rams horn" or "Shovfer." We blow the horn to gather all for the good news. The fields laid fallow in the books of Leviticus. They rested. Isaiah 61:1-3 told us that the Spirit of the Lord is upon us and good news will be proclaimed to the poor, forgiveness of sinners and liberty to captives. That means that our God desires to "ut us some slack" as the Lord shows us grace and mercy. There are viable signs at some of our churches. After a tumultuous season of political, racial and social tension, you, God's holy baptized lay people, work with people of different faiths and races to minister to the poor. That is one of the signs that give me hope. Political tension, but "Let the world go away!" as within our faith communities we do things in a Jubilee way. I look to you and find hope when hope is gone in our society.

In other parishes where there is an effort to separate the lay people from the priest, ou recognize your and mine common priesthood. Did you know that in some places the priest is forbidden from leaving the altar to give the people the sign of peace?

Some of us are full of ourselves and donning the fancy vestments where we should be putting our energy into the homily and serving the poor. It seems as though others are trying to undo the refreshing Spirit of Vatical II. Here at St. Victoria and our Lady of Peace, we take that Spirit and as the late Bishop Sullivan would say, "We try to be church in new ways." Some diocese are even putting some of the lively hymns we use at mass on a "forbidden list." But let those oppressors go sit in a corner and get over themselves while have full, conscious and active participation in the Eucharist.

So, blow the shovfer! Announce a year of favor. Look for more signs of hope as we pilgrim together.
