A PASTORAL MOMENT WITH FR. JIM

One of my favorite televangelists is Joyce Meyers. She can be very witty, yet poignant. She is quoted as saying: "Do you want to see God laugh? Tell him your plans." I will keep that in mind as I prayerfully move towards retirement in a few years.

I remember the tragic day that President Ronald Reagan was shot. Of course, those in his administration were scrambling. Vice President George Bush was supposed to then "take over" and run the show according to the Constitution. But, Secretary of State Alexander Haig jumped the gun and jumped the line and announced: "I'm in charge here!" Needless to say that when President Reagan was soon recovering, Alexander Haig got his walking papers.

It is the leadership's symptom of their addiction to control and power. I hope such dictates to not take place in our diocese. If they do, I want to be the first to ignore their dictatorship.
