

### A PASTORAL MOMENT WITH FR. JIM

In Luke 3:10-18, we see a successful intervention by John the Baptist. When someone or a group does an intervention on a person, it is to prevent that person from ongoing destructive behavior. The destructive behavior can be an addictive behavior or an action that harms oneself and/or others.

John goes out to the desert and draws a crowd. As Richard Rohr, the Franciscan says, "John offered God's forgiveness as free as water while the Pharisees and Scribes made folks jump through all kinds of hoops."

But John was a convincing speaker. The people listening to him felt "convicted." Being convicting in the evangelical sense means that my conscience is troubling me, or in this case, troubling the crowd. John has raised their consciousness that they had been living a sinful life. In the language of the 12 Step Program, they had a "moment of clarity."

One clue is that they asked "What should we do?" That is usually the question when one realizes that they have been in the wrong. Their defensiveness as been broken down and now they want to make amends. There are two kinds of amends. First, there is direct amends. Do right and show sorry to those we have hurt. The second is indirect amends. If we cannot heal those we have directly hurt, then we can do good for others. We can, for example, bring food to church for the impoverished or simply read a story to a child.

Amends heal we the offenders. Amends is a form of penance. We prove to God and to ourselves that we are truly sorry. We are taking a step to make a life change and a new direction. John makes a list of direct amends. Share an extra cloak with someone. Share your food. Tax collectors, stop collecting more than what you are supposed to collect. Soldiers, stop extortion.

Might that we feel "convicted" this season and become better Christians!
