A PASTORAL MOMENT WITH FR. JIM

Many years before the Gospel of Luke was written, Christians gathered as a community. They shared meals, fellowship and The Lord's Supper. They perhaps grew spiritually intimate. Pulling together in time of adversity made them spiritually intimate. When one Christian saw another at the marketplace, they shouted out a greeting. Much like parishioners of our small Catholic faith communities of Our Lady of Peace and St. Victoria. They are glad to see one another and will strike up a conversation.

In the early Christian community of St. Luke, the greeting usually went like this: "Hail, Avery, full of grace" or "Hail, Scott, full of grace." While it was a greeting, it was also meant as a compliment. The Holy Spirit was in their midst as two people who professed Christ met up with each other. That is why the angel appeared to Mary and said, "Hail Mary, full of grace." The pass from Luke would have a wealth of meaning. Mary was one of them and much more.

Of course, the prayer would continue in Luke 1:39-45, when Mary and Elizabeth meet up. As Elizabeth says, "Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." Elizabeth continued, "And how is I that this should happen to me?" Elizabeth is quoting the Hebrew Scriptures. The previous words were those spoke by David when he received he Ark of the Covenant. Mary and Elizabeth are learned women, also very courageous in a male dominated society.

Once again, the Hebrew Scriptures, represented by Elizabeth and the New Testament, are represented by Mary come together. But just as important, how can we greet someone from our faith community while out in public? If we receive a call of affirmation (if not "full of grace") can we believe it? If we believe it, we will act like it.

We might move more toward our potential to holiness.
