

# A Pastoral Moment with Fr. Jim

In Life, because of our brokenness and "fractured ego" (as Richard Rohr would say), we place barriers between ourselves and others. We might chose not to speak with someone with whom we have had words. We may feel uncomfortable with others who speak a different language and might b of a different culture.

While museums are a way of learning about the mistakes of our past, we might want to be in denial about how our ancestors treated Africans or immigrants. So, we seek to take away information in the Smithsonian so we do not have to make amends and build bridges. Who is it or what group do I feel a need to keep my distance? Or, we might not care. Sometimes there is an epidemic of apathy. I heard a brilliant priest friends once say, "The opposite of love is not hate. The opposite of love is apathy."

Notice in the Gospel about Lazarus the poor man and the rich man (named "Divees") there does ot seem to have out right violence against Lazarus. Rather, Lazarus is being ignored. Lazarus is in the doorway while Divees, the rich man pigs out.

As there was a barrier between Lazarus and Divees in this life, so there will be a barrier between them in the next life. All it took for this to happen was apathy on the part of the rich man.

The reference I Luke 16:31 about "one rising from the dead" is about Jesus. By his suffering and death, Jesus bridges the barrier. It is a long way from the attitude of apathy to suffer for another. The Spirit must inflame our hearts.

I like our banner in the commons that says "co-exist" with different faith symbols from around the world. But we are called to do more than co-exist. We are called to love and care. Might that our "co-existing" would be a jumping off to help us transcend any apathy so we can love and care.
